PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE HABIT 4: THINK WIN-WIN



The next two weeks it is all about Think Win-Win, where we transition from leading ourselves to leading others. Depending on the grade level, our students will be learning:

- **Win Win or No Deal**, which is the foundational component of Habit 4. It is based on the paradigm that there is plenty for everyone, and that one person's success doesn't need to be at the expense of others.
- **Emotional Bank Accounts**, which is an analogy for the level of trust in a relationship. Deposits, such as small acts of kindness, increase trust. Withdrawals break down and lessen trust.
- Habit 4 is about balancing the **courage** to share your own feelings with the **consideration** to appreciate and value the feelings of others.
- To make Win-Win work, we must **respect others**.
- Trust is essential to healthy relationships. Being **loyal to the absent** is a powerful way to build trust.
- **Interdependent Living**, or the ability to work with others for mutual benefit.
- When conflict arises, using win-win to **solve problems**.
- **Keeping promises**, or following through when you say you will definitely do something.
- How **mutual respect** shows leadership.

There are many ways for children to **Think Win-Win at home**. Here are two ideas to get you started:

- Make a "wish poster." Start by drawing a line down the middle of the poster. On one side, record your child's hopes, dreams, and wishes. On the other side, record your hopes, dreams, and wishes. Together, look at your wish poster. How can your family work together to make both sets of wishes a reality?
- Define "consideration." Identify people in your family or community who are considerate.
